How can I stand firm?

1. To stand firm, I must understand God's <u>pattern</u> for <u>my life</u>.

Humble yourselves, therefore, under the mighty hand of God so that at the proper time he may exalt you, 1 Peter 5:6 (ESV)

2. To stand firm, I must know <u>God</u> <u>cares</u> for <u>me</u>.

casting all your anxieties on him, because he cares for you. 1 Peter 5:7 (ESV)

3. To stand firm, I must understand the <u>enemy</u> against <u>me</u>.

<u>Be sober-minded; be watchful.</u> Your adversary the devil prowls around <u>like a roaring lion</u>, seeking someone to devour. <u>Resist him, firm in your</u> <u>faith</u>, knowing that the same kinds of suffering are being experienced by your brotherhood throughout the world. 1 Peter 5:8–9 (ESV)

4. To stand firm, I must <u>believe</u> God's <u>promise</u> about my final <u>future</u>.

And after you have suffered a little while, the God of all grace, who has called you to his eternal glory in Christ, will himself restore, confirm, strengthen, and establish you. To him be the dominion forever and ever. Amen. 1 Peter 5:10–11 (ESV)
