> Read Leviticus 2:1-3, 4, 5-6, 7-8, 14-16.

What are the different ways that the grain offering could be offered?

Read Hos. 6:6. This week we see another offering that is a "pleasing aroma to the Lord." What does this phrase mean? What was the key for having one's offering accepted by God?

Read 2 Sam. 24:24. How was the grain offering costly to the people of Israel? What does it mean today to worship God in a "costly" way? What cost is facing you as you seek to honor God?

> Read Lev. 2:2, 2:11, 2:13.

What is the significance of the portion offered being called a "memorial"? What does leaven symbolize? Why was it prohibited from grain offerings? What is the significance of salt?

What is the purpose of the grain offering? How can you live out this form of worship today?

> Read Exodus 34:6-7.

One of the purposes of the grain offering was to remember the covenant made with God. What does this passage tell us about God? Why is it important for you to remember who God is?

Why are we prone to forget the good news of the gospel? What are some ways that setting aside time to remember the gospel will help you grow in confidence in God?
