MAIN POINT

We should celebrate the peace we have through God in Christ regularly in appreciation of all He has done.

CONNECTION QUESTIONS

What is the best party you have been to recently? What was the cause for your celebration?

What occasions can you think of that we set apart for joy and celebration?

BRINGING THE BIBLE TO LIFE

> READ LEVITICUS 3:1-5.

Describe what happens in this sacrifice. What type of animal is sacrificed? What is done to it, and what does it signify?

Why was God given the fat and the organs? What was so special about those parts of the animal? What does this sacrifice teach us about our own worship?

Why are we sometimes reluctant to offer our best to God? What has God done for us that should make us desire to give our best to Him? On the other hand, what is going on in our hearts if we deny God our best?

Read Leviticus 7:31-34. Who was invited to partake of the best parts of the fellowship offering? Why?

> READ LEVITICUS 7:11-18.

On Sunday we talked about all the different reasons people would offer a fellowship offering to God. What were some of the reasons and how is God blessing your life in the same way?

There were no doggy bags taken away from the fellowship offering. What was the role of community in this offering? How does your community help you remember the goodness of God?

On Sunday we talked about the fellowship of the early church. How did the early church take this principle of a fellowship offering and make it their own in light of Christ?

What are a few different ways we commemorate the work of God both corporately and personally?

Where do you make time in your schedule to stop and celebrate all that God has done for you in Christ?

What has God done in your life and in the life of our church that should give us cause to celebrate? What would that celebration look like today?

What is something awesome you see God doing in the life of a brother and sister in Christ? How can you celebrate God's hand at work in the fellowship of the church?
