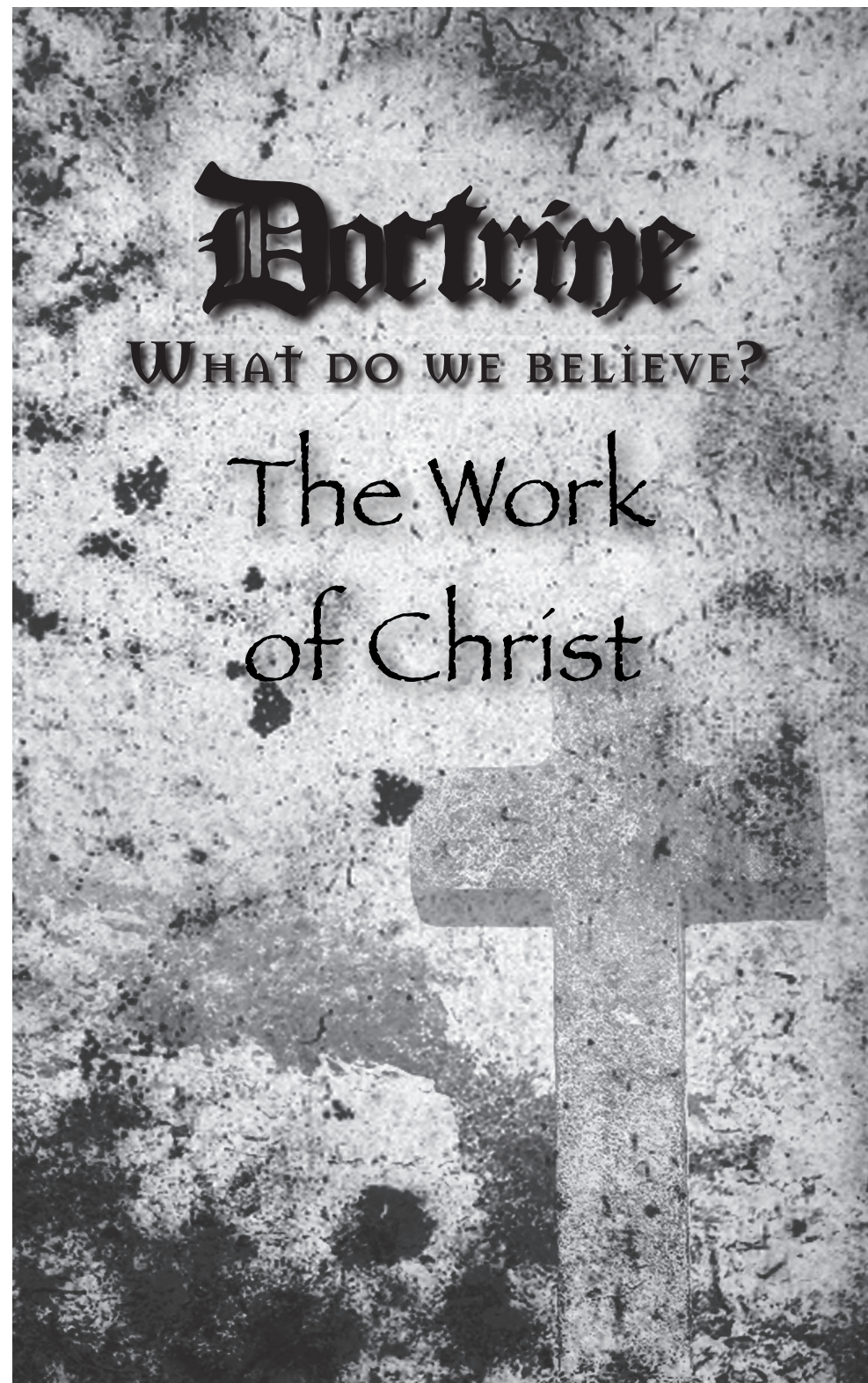

What is crucifixion?

How did Jesus die?

his appearance was so marred, beyond human semblance, and his form beyond that of the children of mankind... Isaiah 52:14 (ESV)

How does God see our attempts at justifying ourselves?

They are like a “polluted garment”.

We have all become like one who is unclean, and all our righteous deeds are like a polluted garment. Isaiah 64:6 (ESV)

They are like a “steaming pile.”

Indeed, I count everything a loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have suffered loss of all things and count them as rubbish, in order that I may gain Christ. Philippians 3:8 (ESV)

Jesus justifies us by the “great exchange.”

For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God. 2 Corinthians 5:21 (ESV)

Why did Jesus die?

But he was wounded for our transgressions; he was crushed for our iniquities. Isaiah 53:5 (ESV)

who was delivered up for our trespasses and raised for our justification. Romans 4:24 (ESV)

...while we were still sinners, Christ died for us. Romans 5:8 (ESV)

For Christ also suffered once for sins, the righteous for the unrighteous, that he might bring us to God... 1 Peter 3:18 (ESV)
