Josephus - Roman Historian

About this time there lived Jesus. A wise man <u>if one ought to call him a man</u>. For he was one who brought surprising feats and was a teacher of such people that accept the truth gladly. He won over many of the Jews and many of the Greeks. <u>He was the Christ</u>. When Pilot, upon hearing of him accused by men with the highest standing among us had condemned him to be crucified, those who had the first place, come to love him, did not give up their affection for him. <u>On the third day he appeared to them restored to life</u>. For the prophets of God that prophesied these and countless other marvelous things about him in the tribe of Christians, so <u>called after him</u>, has still to this day not disappeared. - Antiquities, XVIII, 33

Suetonius - Roman Historian


As the Jews were making constant disturbances at the instigation of Chrestus (common misspelling of Christ), he [Claudius] expelled them from Rome. - Life of Claudius 25.4

Punishment by Nero was inflicted on the Christians, <u>a class of men given</u> to a new and mischievous superstition. - Lives of the Caesars, 26.2

And he began to teach them that the Son of Man must suffer many things and be rejected by the elders and the chief priests and the scribes and be killed, and after three days rise again. And he said this plainly... Mark 8:31–32 (ESV)
