Getting to Know Each Other


1. What did you do over Christmas and New Years? What family did you visit? What presents did you get/give?

- 3. Read Acts 19:1-7 What do we learn about the danger of having part of the Christ story? Read Romans 10:9-10. How much of our community is like these dozen men?
- 4. Read Acts 19:8-10. What evidences did the Jews have that Paul was telling the truth? Why do you think they refused to listen? In what ways can the church today be like the Jews?
- 5. Read Acts 19:11-20. Have you ever had a burning party? If so, what did you burn? Why did you burn it? Is God calling you to have a burning party?
- 6. Read Acts 19:21-41. Sometimes the reason isn't the reason. What was the false reason for the riot? What was the real reason for the riot? What was the reason behind all the reason? (Read Ephesians 6:12).

- 4. Think of a time of crisis in your life. Did you discover anything about finding your identity in something or someone other than Jesus through that experience?
