5. Is my sin giving me a <u>hard heart</u> toward God and others?

...due to their hardness of heart. Ephesians 4:18 (ESV)

6. Is my sin leaving me <u>insensitive</u> to the pain I am causing God and others?

They have become callous... Ephesians 4:19 (ESV)

The problem is always sin.

1. Is my sin warping my thinking?

...you must no longer walk as the Gentiles do, in t<u>he futility of their minds</u>. Ephesians 4:17 (ESV)

How do I stop sinning?

7. Has my sin led me to lose control?

...have given themselves up to <u>sensuality</u>, <u>greedy to practice every kind of</u> <u>impurity</u>. Ephesians 4:19 (ESV)

2. Is my sin <u>darkening</u> my mind?

They are <u>darkened in their understanding</u>,... Ephesians 4:18 (ESV)

The solution is always Jesus.

But that is not the way you learned Christ!— Ephesians 4:20 (ESV)

- 3. Is my sin <u>separating</u> me from God?
 - ...<u>alienated from the life of God</u>... Ephesians 4:18 (ESV)

1. Do I know Jesus?

assuming that you have heard about him ... Ephesians 4:21 (ESV)

4. Is my sin <u>blinding</u> me to its consequences?

...God because of the ignorance that is in them,... Ephesians 4:18 (ESV)

2. Am I growing in Jesus?

...and were taught in him, as the truth is in Jesus, Ephesians 4:21 (ESV)

3. Am I letting go of my old <u>lifestyle</u> that leads me toward <u>sin</u> and replacing it with a new <u>lifestyle</u> that leads me toward <u>Jesus</u>?

to <u>put off your old self</u>, <u>which belongs to your former manner of life</u> and is corrupt through deceitful desires, and to be renewed in the spirit of your minds, and to <u>put on the new self</u>, <u>created after the likeness of God</u> in true righteousness and holiness. Ephesians 4:22–24 (ESV)

4. Am I letting go of a <u>lifestyle</u> that leads me toward an <u>ineffective</u> life and replacing it with a <u>lifestyle</u> that leads me toward a <u>productive</u> life for Jesus?

<u>making the best use of the time</u>, because the days are evil. Ephesians 5:16 (ESV)

For if these qualities are yours and are increasing, <u>they keep you from being</u> <u>ineffective or unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ.</u> 2 Peter 1:8 (ESV)

Conclusion

- 1. **Spend time enjoying Jesus.** We can't pursue sin and Christ at the same time. Heading toward one will always take us away from the other.
- 2. **Change my lifestyle.** Am I letting go of a lifestyle that is leading me toward sin and replacing it with a lifestyle that is leading me toward Jesus? Am I letting go of a lifestyle that leads me to be ineffective and replacing it with a lifestyle that leads me towards the good works God planned for me to do?
