1. Do you enjoy work? What is your favorite part of what you do for a living? What is your least favorite part? What would you consider to be your "dream job"?

## Into the Text

- 2. **Read Gen. 1:28-31; 2:15.** What do these verses tell us about God's original plan for work before sin entered the world? How is this original plan different from what we experience in work today?
  - a. Read Gen. 3:17-19. How did sin affect work during the Fall?
  - b. Think of your own work. How is God's original plan for work still seen in what you do? How are the effects of sin seen in what you do?
- 3. In our sermon, we talked about how to effectively be a Christian employee.
  - a. How would a Christian man who was passed over for a promotion because of his unwillingness to partake in unethical practices show respect to his boss?
  - b. How should a manual worker work as if he were working for Christ? A businessman? A stay-at-home mother?

- c. **Read 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18.** How are these verses helpful in our approach to work?
- d. **Read Ephesians 6:5-9.** Here Paul tells us that we should work as if for God, and that we will receive a reward from him for doing so. How does the promise of rewards play a part in our mindset toward work?
- e. How do these verses apply to those who are retired? To those who are stay-at-home mothers? To those who are self-employed? To the unemployed?
- 4. In this passage, Paul also addresses bosses and how they should lead in the workplace. How are Paul's words to employers radical here?
  - a. Why is it important that the same standard of attitudes apply to employers as well as employees?
  - b. How is the reminder that Jesus is the ultimate authority help those who are in authority positions in the workplace?
