Jesus' Claim - I am the light of the world.

Again Jesus spoke to them, saying, "<u>I am the light of the world</u>. Whoever follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life." John 8:12 (ESV)

These words he spoke in the treasury, as he taught in the temple; but no one arrested him, because his hour had not yet come. John 8:20 (ESV)

The Bible uses light and darkness as a metaphor to describe the world.

What is the problem with darkness?

- 1. No sense of orientation
- 2. No way to avoid danger and enjoy beauty
- 3. The world grows cold and dies

Send out your light and your truth; let them lead me; Psalm 43:3 (ESV)

The unfolding of your words gives light; Psalm 119:130 (ESV)

...the Lord my God lightens my darkness. Psalm 18:28 (ESV)

Light and darkness is a <u>strong</u> theme in the Gospel of John.

In him was life, and the life was the light of men. John 1:4 (ESV)

...The true light, which gives light to everyone, was coming into the world. John 1:8–9 (ESV)

Light and darkness is the background of John 8.

Again Jesus spoke to them, saying, "<u>I am the light of the world</u>. Whoever follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life." John 8:12 (ESV)

Then the angel of God who was going before the host of Israel moved and went behind them, and the pillar of cloud moved from before them and stood behind them, coming between the host of Egypt and the host of Israel. And there was the cloud and the darkness. And it lit up the night without one coming near the other all night. Exodus 14:19–20 (ESV)

And as he was praying, the appearance of his face was altered, and his clothing became dazzling white. And behold, two men were talking with him, Moses and Elijah, who appeared in glory and <u>spoke of his departure</u> (exodus), which he was about to accomplish at Jerusalem. Luke 9:29–31 (ESV)
