A New Commandment



John 13:18-38

One of his disciples, whom Jesus loved, was reclining at table at Jesus' side, so Simon Peter motioned to him to ask Jesus of whom he was speaking. So that disciple, leaning back against Jesus, said to him, "Lord, who is it?" Jesus answered, "It is he to whom I will give this morsel of bread when I have dipped it." So when he had dipped the morsel, he gave it to Judas, the son of Simon Iscariot. Then after he had taken the morsel, Satan entered into him. Jesus said to him, "What you are going to do, do quickly." John 13:23–27 (ESV)

I am not speaking of all of you; I know whom I have chosen. But the Scripture will be fulfilled, '<u>He who ate my bread has lifted his heel against</u> <u>me</u>.' I am telling you this now, before it takes place, that when it does take place you may believe that I am he. Truly, truly, I say to you, whoever receives the one I send receives me, and whoever receives me receives the one who sent me." <u>After saying these things</u>, <u>Jesus was troubled in</u> <u>his spirit</u>, and testified, "Truly, truly, I say to you, one of you will betray <u>me</u>." John 13:18–21 (ESV)

<u>Then after he had taken the morsel, Satan entered into him. Jesus said to him</u>, "What you are going to do, do quickly." Now no one at the table knew why he said this to him. Some thought that, because Judas had the moneybag, Jesus was telling him, "Buy what we need for the feast," or that he should give something to the poor. So, after receiving the morsel of bread, he immediately went out. And it was night. John 13:27–30 (ESV)

1. Big public sin always starts as small <u>unconfessed</u> private sin.

The disciples looked at one another, uncertain of whom he spoke. John 13:22 (ESV)

If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness. 1 John 1:9 (ESV)

Therefore, confess your sins to one another and pray for one another, that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person has great power as it is working. James 5:16 (ESV)

2. When we sin, Satan knows our weakness and will continue to <u>attack</u> it.
