Mr. Doer knows he needs a mirror every day.

God only <u>blesses</u> my doing, not my hearing.

...being no hearer who forgets but a doer who acts, <u>he will be blessed in his doing</u>. James 1:25 (ESV)


But he said, "Blessed rather are those who hear the word of God and keep it!" Luke 11:28 (ESV)

- Did you look in a mirror before you came to church today?
- Were you ever accused of having something go in one ear and out the other?
- Do you want to grow as a Christian to become more pleasing to Christ?

Of his own will he brought us forth by the word of truth, that we should be a kind of firstfruits of his creatures. James 1:18 (ESV)

Therefore put away all filthiness and rampant wickedness and receive with meekness the implanted word, which is able to save your souls. James 1:21 (ESV)

Two kinds of men...

Mr. <u>Hearer</u>

But be doers of the word, and <u>not hearers only, deceiving</u> <u>yourselves</u>. James 1:22 (ESV)

Mr. <u>Doer</u>

But be doers of the word,... James 1:22 (ESV)

So whether we are at home or away, we make it our aim to please him. 2 Corinthians 5:9 (ESV)

For if anyone is a hearer of the word and not a doer, he is like a man who looks intently at his natural face in a mirror. For he looks at himself and goes away and at once forgets what he was like. James 1:23–24 (ESV)

Mr. Doer lets the Word confront him.

But the one who looks into the perfect law, the law of liberty, and perseveres, being no hearer who forgets <u>but a doer who acts</u>, he will be blessed in his doing. James 1:25 (ESV)
