- 1. What does <u>science</u> say about gender dysphoria?
 - 1. Transsexuals commit <u>suicide</u> at an astounding rate.
 - 1. One study claims the transsexual suicide rate is <u>25</u> times greater than the general population. (<u>http://www.nbcnews.com/id/40279043/ns/health-health_care/</u>)
 - 2. Another web site dedicated to the transgender lifestyle claims the transgender mortality rate is between <u>60</u> to <u>70</u> percent. (<u>http://www.lauras-playground.com/transgender_mortality.htm</u>)
 - 3. <u>31</u> percent of those that commit suicide are transgender. (<u>http://www.tglynnsplace.com/suicide.htm</u>)
 - 4. Between <u>30</u> to <u>50</u> percent of transgender patients commit suicide either before or in the year after their sex change surgery. (Meyer, Walt (2011-06-21). Paper Genders (Kindle Locations 271-272). Make Waves Publishing. Kindle Edition.)
 - 5. Up to <u>90</u> percent of those that undergo sex reassignment surgery can not be found for follow up. They either commit suicide, are addicted to drugs and/or alcohol, return to their birth gender or do not want to be found. (Randi Ettner, Stan Monstrey, A. Evan Eyler, editors, Principles of transgender medicine and surgery, (The Haworth Press, 2007), Chapter 5: Surgery: general principles by Stan Monstrey, Griet De Cuypere, Randi Ettner, 96)

- 2. Transsexuals are not born that way.
 - 1. The <u>hormone wash</u> theory is just that, a <u>theory</u>.

 - 1. <u>25</u> percent of transsexuals are schizophrenic.
 - 2. <u>75</u> percent of transsexuals are diagnosed with psychiatric illnesses, personality disorders or mood dissociative disorders.

2. What does the **Bible** say about gender dysphoria?

2. God prohibits gender switching.

Or do you not know that the unrighteous will not inherit the kingdom of God? Do not be deceived; neither fornicators, nor idolaters, nor adulterers, <u>nor effeminate</u>, nor homosexuals, 1 Corinthians 6:9 (NASB95)

- Arsenokoitai men who take men to bed.
- Malakoi The soft or effeminate one. Men who sexually function in a feminine way.

Every man who prays or prophesies with his head covered dishonors his head, but every wife who prays or prophesies with her head uncovered dishonors her head, since it is the same as if her head were shaven. 3. Transgender desires are rooted in sin.

All 50 patients were:

- Guilt-ridden homosexuals men looking to become more effeminate in their homosexual relationships.
- Older cross-dressing men eager to advance their cross-dressing fantasies to a surgical level.

<u>NO</u> patients experienced better work, relational or emotional engagement after their surgery than before.

My personal feeling is that surgery is not a proper treatment for a psychiatric disorder, and it's clear to me that these patients had severe psychological problems that don't go away following surgery. —Dr. Meyer, head of the sex reassignment surgery department of John Hopkins University.
